## NOMENCLATURE OF EMPLOYMENTS, PROFESSIONS AND TRADES

This nomenclature that aims at giving a picture of the labour market is used in household questionnaire through questions: ER6, ER14a and ER19, and also the employees form (O.06).

This nomenclature picks up what the individual really does in his/her employment: his/her profession, trade, task or function. These notions must not be mistaken with the *training* of the individual.

**Watch out:** These notions must not be confused with the training that the individual received.

**Example:** A senior technician of telecommunication who carries out commercial activities is coded as a trader and not as a technician.

It is important to make the difference between the levels of training and the function in the enterprise. An electricity technician in the enterprise is the one occupying that function in the enterprise. Take note here that he may not have the diploma of an electricity technician.

This nomenclature is divided into 8 big items and is coded on **4** positions.

## **1. Agriculture, Breeding, Hunting and fishery**

This first group is subdivided into two sub-groups:

- **11. Agriculture ;**
- **12. Breeding, Hunting and fishery.**

The codes of this first group go from:

**1101 to 1109** for the sub-group « **Agriculture** »;

**1201 to 1206** for the sub-group « **Breeding, Hunting and fishery** ».

This group is made up of professions whose main task consists in practising agriculture to get product from agriculture, silviculture (wood, charcoals), and fishery, in rearing or hunting animals, in fishing or fish breeding, in exploiting natural or planted forest. Products from this activity will be later on sold to buyers, to commercial bodies or on markets, or self consumed, offered or even lost.

This group is made up of individuals who carry out agricultural activities regardless of their status, i.e. exercising as chief of exploitation, associated persons for exploitation, family helps, paid or unpaid person and agricultural labourers

*Particular case:* Pambe man or woman (in the West region of Cameroon) is an own account worker, but is classified in the same item as an agricultural labourer who in return is wage earner (**1106 is the code**).

## **2. Members of the executive and legislative body, administrative authorities, managers and senior staff of enterprises, clergy**

This second group is subdivided in to four subgroups:

- **21- Members of the executive and legislative body;**
- **22- Other administrative Authorities;**
- **23- Managers and senior staff of enterprises;**
- **24- Clergy member.**

The codes of this second group start from:

**2101 to 2102** for the subgroup « **Members of the executive and legislative body** »;

**2201 to 2205** for the subgroup « **Other administrative Authorities** »;

**2301 to 2302** for the subgroup « **Managers and senior staff of enterprises** »;

**2401 only** for the sub group « **Clergy member** ».

This group includes professions that consist in defining and formulating government policies, laws and rules, and in watching over the implementations, in representing the national government and acting on its behalf, or in preparing, orientating and coordinating the policy and activity of an enterprise or organisation or its departments and internal services. Furthermore, it includes people having a ministry in an approved church denomination having vowed to live a consecrated life. This group also contains people who give spiritual advises and conducts. They are not in this case from a particular approved church, or recognized as religious people.

The group “Manager and senior staff of enterprises” (**23**), concerns only bosses. Own accounts workers should be coded in group 7 “craftmen and labourers”. For example, own accounts mechanics employing even more than 5 persons (family helps or apprentices) are classified as “craftmen and labourers of mechanics, electronics labourer of “hot and cold” (**code 7106**). The

notion of enterprise refers to the different types, private or public regardless of their sector of activity.

**Particular case:** The witch-doctor like the magician/tradi-practitioner/traditional healer should be considered as craftsmen and labourers of other services (**code 7205**).

### **3. Liberal scientific and intellectual professions**

The third group is subdivided into three subgroups:

- **31- Liberal scientific and intellectual professions excluding those related to ICT and the Environment;**
- **32- Liberal scientific and intellectual professions related to ICT;**
- **33- Liberal scientific and intellectual professions related to the environment.**

The codes of this group start from:

**3101 to 3106** for the subgroup « **Liberal scientific and intellectual professions excluding those related to ICT and the Environment**»;

**3201 to 3204** for the subgroup « **Liberal scientific and intellectual professions related to ICT**»;

**3301 to 3303** for the subgroup « **Liberal scientific and intellectual professions related to the environment**».

This group includes professions with main tasks requiring high professional knowledge in physics and life sciences or human and social sciences. The exercise of the above tasks is regulated. Very often it requires diplomas, as well as the respect of working rules, which implies the presence of an ordinal organisation (medical doctor, pharmacist, lawyer, Chartered accountant...).

Are also found in this group, legal or technical professions less strictly regulated (counselling in management, engineering, painting, drawer, musician..), fitting with diploma conditions.

This group only comprises of **own-account workers**. So, medical doctors, or pharmacist working as wage earners (including the second case as pharmacist of dispensaries/private pharmacies) are not found in this group. For example, three situations can be observed from a gynaecologist:

- **he** can work as a liberal person for his own account. In this case he is in **group 3, coded 3101**;
- **he** can be the chief of a clinic that is an enterprise head. He's therefore in **group 2** coded **2301 or 2302** depending on the size of the clinic;
- **he** can be a chief of service in a hospital. He is a senior executive. His code is **4301** of **group 4**.

In the same manner, artists (painter, carvers, etc) who earn salaries, working as a family help or apprentice fall under group 7 and coded **7112**.

**Particular case:** Liberal nurses are found in **group 5, code 5301**.

### **4. Senior executive**

This group is subdivided in to three subgroups:

- **41- Senior executive in enterprises;**
- **42- Senior executive of the public service and councils;**

➤ **43- Senior executive (Public service and enterprise).**

The codes of this group start from:

**4101 to 4103** for the subgroup « **Senior executive in enterprises** »;

**4201 to 4204** for the subgroup « **Senior executive of the public service and councils** »;

**4301 to 4315** for the subgroup « **Senior executive (Public service and enterprises)** ».

This group comprises of professions that require technical knowledge and experiences in physics, life sciences, social or human sciences.

This group is only for wage earners who work in enterprises, public service or in council. It's the status of wage earners that distinguishes this group from the preceding one. For example, the wage earner chartered accountant in an enterprise is in this group and is **coded 4101**, whereas the one who works as an own account or a consultant is in **group 3, code 3103**.

It's divided into 3 subgroups depending on the type of post or profession.

- "Senior executive in the private or public enterprises" **(41)**, comprises specific posts in enterprises.
- "Senior executive of the public service and in the councils" **(42)**, comprises specific posts public service.
- "Senior executive (public service and enterprise" **(43)**, comprises the mixed posts.

Particular case: the private class teacher of the secondary education level is **coded 4304** whether he's own account or wage earners.

**5. Medium executive and technician**

It's subdivided in to 3 subgroups:

- **51-Medium executives and technicians in enterprises;**
- **52-Medium executives and technicians in the public service and councils;**
- **53- Medium executives and technicians (public service and enterprise).**

The codes of this group start from:

- **5101 to 5103** for the subgroup: « Medium executives and technicians in enterprises »;
- **5201 to 5204** for the subgroup: « Medium executives and technicians in the public service and councils »;
- **5301 to 5310** for the subgroup: « Medium executives and technicians (public service and enterprise) ».

This group comprises professions that require technical knowledge and experience in physics and life science, social and human sciences. It is devoted to classify persons who carry out execution and officering tasks.

Like the preceding group, it comprises only wage earners working in enterprises, public service or councils. The only difference is the level of competence. It is exactly organized like **group 4**.

Particular cases

-A private primary school teacher is **coded 5302** whether he is own-account or wage earner.

-The hospital block heads (Major) are initially nurses and are coded as such in **5301**.

## **6. Trade employee and own account trader**

It's subdivided in to 3 subgroups:

- 61-Trade employee
- 62-Own account trader
- 63-Non trade employee

The codes of this group start from:

- **6101** for the subgroup « Trade employee »;
- **6201** to **6212** for the subgroup « Own account trader »;
- **6301** to **6310** for the subgroup « Non trade employee ».

This group includes professions that require knowledge and experience that permit to order, to stock, to carry out data processing and to call back information. These tasks are:

- secretariat works, transcription on a text processing machine, or on other office machines, calculations and recording of numeric data and work related to customers service, coming mainly from mail services, cashiers works and taking of appointments;
- Personal and domestic services, protection of persons and properties services, security services, keeping of public order;
- sale of goods in stores, on the market or in the street;
- catering/ restaurant services;
- simple works in the mine industry, agriculture or fishery building and public works as well as manufacturing industries.

**The sub-groups should be understood as follows:**

-“trade employees” **(61)**: these are people who are not own-account; they are either wage earners or family helps or apprentices.

- “own-account traders” **(62)**: these are own –accounts, and not bosses (employers) who are classified in group 2.

-“non trade employees” **(63)**: this category comprises all type of status in the employment.

Particular cases:

- Taxi men (even those who work for their own account) are classified in this category **(code 6304)**.
- Likewise insurance brokers, suppliers **(code 6301)**.

## **7. Craftsmen and labourers**

This group is subdivided into trois subgroups:

- **71-Craftsmen and labourers of industry;**
- **72- Craftsmen and labourers of services;**
- **73- Workers of the environment.**

The codes of this group start from:

- **7101 to 7113** for the subgroup « **craftsmen and labourers of industry** »;
- **7201 to 7211** for the subgroup « **craftsmen and labourers of services** »;
- **7300** for the subgroup: « **Workers of the environment** ».

This group includes on the one hand, professions that the main tasks require for their accomplishment, the knowledge and the experience peculiar to handicraft and trade of labourers related to them, which among other things, implies the familiarity with the machines and the equipment, as well as with each of the stages of the production and with the nature and the uses of the manufactured products. These tasks consists at extracting raw materials from the ground, constructing buildings and other works, at manufacturing various products and handicraft products, in giving personal care. This group comprises on the other hand, professions that require knowledge and experience, which permit to do simple and routine works for the majority of them, done with hand tools and for which an important physical effort is often needed. In some rare cases, these tasks require the least initiative or judgment.

It is divided into 2 subgroups: “Industries labourers and craftmen” (**71**) and “services labourers and craftsmen” (**72**). The distinction dwells on the **type of activity** exercised: of industry or of service, regardless of the status in the employment or the activity in the enterprise in which the labourer works. For example a building painter is a craft man, even if he works for Fokou Enterprise. Nevertheless, craftsmen and labourers mostly work for their own account or in little team.

Particular case: The work of the butcher in **code 7111** corresponds to the one who transforms meat: slaughtering of animals, carving into pieces and selling in retail or in wholesale. If the individual buys pieces of meat in order to sell as it is, he is a trader, **coded 6203** “meat, fish and crustacean seller”.

## **8. Armed forces and police**

The armed forces and police officers are people who willingly or by obligation, normally serve in various armed forces and in the auxiliary services and who do not enjoy the freedom of having a civil employment. Are parts of these: the permanent members of land army, of the navy and air force or other armies or services as well as people recruited by conscription for one lawful period in order to acquire a military training or to achieve another service.

Are excluded, from this group, people having a civil employment in public establishments dealing with defence, personnel of the army; customs officers, the borders guards and members of other civil services; people temporary out to achieve one lawful period of instruction or military exercise, the reservists who are not in active service. The qualification level was not taken into consideration in order to delimit the range of this big group. It should be noted that a medical doctor of the army will be classified as a doctor and not like an army officer.

## NOMENCLATURE OF ACTIVITIES

This nomenclature classifies survey units according to the nature of the activity exercised. It is used only in:

- **Household questionnaire**, questions: ER7 and ER14b.
- **Employment form**, question EM06.
- **Employees form**, questions O.03 et O.08.

### I. Presentation of the nomenclature

The term activity characterises **what a production unit or an enterprise does**. It is different from the notion of employment, which characterises what the individual is doing: his trade, his task, his function, etc. For example, an individual who works in the Brasseries du Cameroun and goes for distribution is a driver by profession; **code 6304** in the nomenclature of employments. The activity of the enterprise where he works is “Manufacturing of beer and malt” **coded 131** in the nomenclature of activities.

In order to better codify the activity, you must describe precisely what the production unit does and the main products and / or services born from this activity.

This nomenclature is divided into 4 big items and is coded on 3 positions.

#### 1. *The activities of the primary sector*

This group is made up of activities that consist in exploiting natural, vegetable, or animal resources. These activities are agriculture, breeding and hunting, forest exploitation and silviculture. Their codes start from 011 to 042.

##### Particular case

Picking palm wine is considered as an activity of transformation, it's coded in “Manufacturing of other alcoholic drinks” (**code 132**).

#### 2. *The activities of industries*

They are extraction, transformation of raw material into finished material, production and distribution of electricity, gas and water, and building works. Their codes go from 050 to 312.

#### 3. *Trade and repair of motorcycle and vehicles*

This group corresponds to the purchase/sale in the state i.e. without transformation of goods and to repairs of motorcycle and vehicles. It's made up of repairs of motorcycle and vehicles, motorcycles and car trade, accessories and fuel trade, wholesale trade, retail trade, and the activities of the intermediaries of trade. It corresponds to codes 321 to 325.

The item entitled “Other wholesale trade” (**code 324**) equally includes the intermediaries of the wholesale trade. The same thing is applied to “retail trade” (**code 325**), which includes the intermediaries of the retail trade.

##### Particular case

The retail sale of meat, without transformation, is a trade activity: “retail trade” (code 325). If on the contrary, the individual is a butcher who buys live animals, kill and cut into pieces to sell either in retail or whole sale, the activity of the production unit is industrial;” production, transformation and conservation of meat made products ”( 071).

#### 4. *The activities of service*

They are activities of catering, transport, telecommunication, financial and insurance activities, services to enterprises, public administration activities, education, health, associative activities, personal services, etc. This item corresponds to **codes 331 to 440**.

## **II. Remarks on the usage of the nomenclature**

The risks of confusion are high between the different sectors of activities as seen in the example below.

### **1. Distinction between the primary sector or industry and trade**

The primary sector activities or industrial sector activities should not be mistaken with trade when the products are sold by the producer himself.

A person who rears and who sells his cows in the market is not trading. His activity is of the primary sector: "Cattle rearing" (**code 021**). It is the same thing for the female farmer who sells the plantains that she produces. The activity here is "bananas farming." (**code 013**).

The woman who produces fritters and who sells them herself, is by so doing, working in an enterprise of production "bakery, pastry making, biscuit factory." (**code 111**) and not in a trade enterprise.

The lady who sells cassava sticks(*miondo, mintumba*) is by so doing working in a production unit trade, if she buys cassava in bags in order to retail it in the market (**code 325**). If she buys cassava or cultivates/farms it, then makes "cassava sticks (*miondo, mintumba*)" and retails them in the market, she is by so doing working in an industrial production unit: "Cassava processing" (**code 083**).

### **2. Distinction between the primary sector or industry and trade**

The production unit of the woman who roasts fish or who sells fritters and pulp has an activity of "Catering and bars" (**code 332**) and not an activity of trade. Likewise, an owner of an off licence who has some seats where customers seats in order to drink, has an activity of "Catering and bars" (**code 332**) and not Trade.

### **3. Distinction between services and industry**

An own-account seamstress is carrying on an industrial activity if her turnover is mainly found in the making of dress "Making of clothing articles" (**code 155**). If on the contrary, she mainly mends one or many second hand dresses, therefore it is an activity of service: "Repairs of personal and domestic goods" (**code 423**).

The shoemaker works in an industrial production unit, if the main activity consists in the making of shoes "Manufacturing of shoes" (**code 162**). If on the contrary, he mainly mends shoes, it is an activity of service "Other repairs of personal and domestic goods" (**code 423**).

### **4. Other remarks**

- Works related to plumbing repairs, are put under "Installation and finishing work" (**code 312**).
- Ministries, delegations and local collectivities are classified in item "Activities of general public administration and services given to the whole collectively" (**code 391**). The Funds for Stabilisation of Hydrocarbon products (CSPH) and the Cameroon Sinking Funds (CAA), the Central Bureau for Census and Population Studies (BUCREP) and the National Institute of Statistics (NIS) are classified in this group.
- Services for education (primary schools, high schools, secondary schools, etc) whether private or public are classified in item "Education" (**code 400**). The supervising ministry, for example the Ministry of Basic Education or that of secondary education is in **code 391**.
- Health Services (health centres, dispensaries, consulting room, lab for analysis, etc) are coded in item "Activities for human health" (**code 411**), whereas the Ministry of Public Health is classified in **code 391**.

- Public enterprises are classified according to their main activities. Consequently:
  - o The CRTV is in « Artistic, recreative, cultural and sport activities » (code **424**).
  - o The SCDP (Société Camerounaise des Dépôts Pétroliers) is in « Annex and auxiliary activities of transports » (**code 346**).
  - o CNPS (National and Social Insurance Funds) is in « Social security activity» (**code 392**).
- For people working for a household as a house servant (driver, cook, watchman, etc) the activity of the enterprise is “Domestic services” (**code 426**).
- There is an unclear limit between what one can or cannot describe as transformation. In these cases, see your supervisor where there’s any doubt.

## NOMENCLATURE OF TRAININGS

It is part of the key elements of the survey. It informs on trainings and their codes. This nomenclature that aims at grasping the diploma or training of the interviewees having gone at least to primary school refers *exclusively to the household questionnaire, question ED17*.

It gathers two informations: the domain of training undergone (electronics, computer sciences, manufacturing of clothes, etc.) and the attained level (technician, senior technician, engineer, etc.). It is often difficult to outline the borders between several types of training level. It is the case between «On-the-job-training (training on the spot)» and «training in an institute or in a training centre» on the one hand and between «On-the-job-training» and «no training» on the other hand.

***On-the-job- training:*** It is an apprenticeship in an enterprise; i.e. a structure in which training is not a major concern. This training is different from «no training» by the character “conscience of the individual” that receives it. For example, a young woman doing restaurant work and who learned cooking from her mother as a result of housework will not say that this knowledge is on-the-job-training. In this study, that knowledge is not considered as training.

***Training in an institute or in a training centre:*** It refers to an apprenticeship having taken place in a structure made for a training purpose without ending with an official diploma (technician, BTS/NHD, engineer diploma, etc). However, this training can be sanctioned by the deliverance of an attestation.

For example, an individual who has undergone training in office automation from a training centre of the quarter will be **coded 201**. If on the contrary, this individual had learned how to use WORD and EXCEL with a private individual, the training is an on-the-job-training and is coded **101**.
