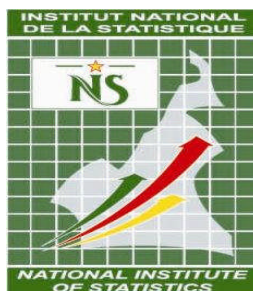

SOMMAIRE

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NOTE OF PRESENTATION OF NOMENCLATURES

The different nomenclatures have been developed mainly to facilitate the organization of data collection. Their purpose for this survey is essentially to provide a good description of the labor market in Cameroon and the informal sector in particular.

This document includes the nomenclatures of administrative districts, diplomas and training, jobs and branches of activity, products and other codes (this is a section of the document which specifies the codes for certain questions, these could not be included in the questionnaires). Each of these nomenclatures concerns specific sections of the questionnaire and one or more questions in these sections.

1- Nomenclature of administrative districts

By Presidential Decree No. 2008/376 of 12 November 2008 on the administrative organization of the Republic of Cameroon, the Cameroonian territory is divided into regions, divisions and sub-divisions. Decree No. 2010/198 of 16 June 2010 establishes districts in sub-divisions. These administrative divisions are numbered in a sequential order. It is used in SECTIONS 00 : « HOUSEHOLD IDENTIFICATION AND CONTROL INFORMATION» of the main questionnaire and "GENERAL INFORMATION" for the community questionnaire.

2- Nomenclature of employment, professions and trades

This nomenclature which aims to provide a vision of the labor market in Cameroon is requested in SECTION 04: "EMPLOYMENT AND INCOME OF HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS", questions Q (4.29) et Q (4.51).

3- Nomenclature of activities and products

3.1 Nomenclature of activities

This nomenclature classifies people having a job according to the nature of the activity conducted. It is used in SECTION 04: "EMPLOYMENT AND INCOME OF HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS", questions Q (4.30) et Q (4.52), and in SECTION 10: NON-AGRICULTURAL ENTERPRISES, question Q (10.17)

3.2 Nomenclature of products (activities and products)

It aims to provide a fairly precise classification of services offered and products sold or used as input by the informal production units in the course of their activities. It refers exclusively to the SECTION 10: "NON-AGRICULTURAL ENTERPRISES", question Q (10.16). It is important to read carefully the note of use which precedes some of these nomenclatures in order to master the small subtleties essential to the good codification of the target variables.

A. NOMENCLATURE OF ADMINISTRATIVE UNITS

I. Presentation of the nomenclature of administrative units

The purpose of the nomenclature of administrative units is to assign to each administrative unit a unique code that identifies it in all administrations, companies, state, parastatal and private establishments, enterprises, etc. This nomenclature makes it possible to codify regions, divisions and sub-divisions.

For ECAM 5, the Nomenclature of administrative units is used to inform questions (0.02), (0.03) of the main questionnaire, Q0.2, Q0.3 of the community questionnaire..

The current division of the national territory is in accordance with Decrees "**No. 2008/376 of November 12, 2008 on the administrative organization of the Republic of Cameroon**" and "**No. 2010/198 of June 16, 2010 on the erection of Districts in Sub-divisions**", in the following manner:

- 10 regions;
- 58 divisions distributed in the 10 regions;
- 360 councils whose boundaries correspond to the territorial boundaries of the 360 sub-divisions.

The code of administrative units has two, four and six digits respectively for regions, divisions and sub-divisions. The basic rule is that the code of a unit contains the code of the unit which is superior to it. Thus, the codes of all the divisions of a region each contain the code of the region; same principle for sub-divisions.

B. NOMENCLATURE OF TRADES, EMPLOYMENTS AND PROFESSIONS

I. Presentation of the nomenclature of trades, employments and professions

The Nomenclature of trades, employments and professions is designed to give a statistical description or to analyze the labour market and the economic and social structure.

For ECAM 5, this nomenclature concerns SECTION 04 “Economic activity and income of household members” questions Q(4.29) and Q(4.51).

The classification unit is employment. **Employment** is defined as a set of tasks that are assigned (or may be assigned) to a person and must be performed by that person. Paid employments are distinguished from self-employment.

Paid employments are those whose incumbents have explicit or implicit employment contracts (written or oral) that provide them with a basic remuneration that does not depend directly on the income of the unit for which they work. This unit may be a company, a non-for-profit institution, a government unit or a household. People with "paid employment" usually receive a salary or remuneration, but they may also receive sales commissions, a pay per job or be paid in kind in the form of food, housing or training.

Self-employment is where remuneration is directly dependent on profits (or potential profits) from goods produced and services rendered (where self-consumption is considered to be part of profits). Incumbents take the management decisions of the company, or delegate such decisions while retaining responsibility for the profitability of the company.

A trade is a **job** from which one can earn **revenue** to earn a living. It may be qualified or not. Can be considered a **skilled trade**, any activity, industrial, craft or otherwise, whose exercise is recognized, officially or traditionally, as requiring special qualifications, which can be acquired only after several years of study, training or practice.

A **profession** is a **specialized trade** which requires, in most cases, a long period of training (medical doctors, lawyers, accountants, etc.). Traditionally, **professions are run by associations that provide training, handle recognition of degrees, and provide various services to members**. In some sectors, such as civil engineering and architecture, recognition of the degree is mandatory. Therefore, one can not practice the profession, or even use the professional title without having obtained professional certification.

II. Activity classification criteria

A person can only be classified by profession or occupational group based on their employment relationship. This is an employment held. In this context, "having an employment" is considered in a broad sense, so that the classification can be applicable to all employment situations. As a result, depending on the circumstances, a person may be classified into different professions if they have more than one employment. Priority rules for selecting an employment to be classified (main employment) are usually based on the greater number of working hours assigned to certain jobs or the highest income earned during the reference period.

An employment is classified according to **the nature of the skills that are required** to perform the tasks of the employment **and not in relation to how those skills were acquired**. **The fact that the incumbent of an employment has skills that are not required for the employment is not taken into account**.

Two dimensions of the concept of skills are used in the definition of *MEPC* groups. This is the skill level and skill specialization.

- ✓ *The skill level, which depend on the complexity and spectrum of tasks to be performed; the complexity of tasks having priority over the spectrum.*
- ✓ *Skills specialization, which reflects the type of knowledge used, tools and equipment used, materials worked, or with which one works, and the nature of the goods and services produced. It should be noted that the MEPC focuses on the skills required to perform the tasks of a profession and not on the fact that a worker in a particular profession is more or less competent than another worker in the same profession or other professions.*

Words used to describe the field, production processes, etc. must be used as labels for the core skill sets that relate to the professions. The same kind of words can be used to describe the type of activity, that is, the industry of the production unit.

III. Codification of employments

Skill level references are not made in the definitions of the two groups, respectively Directors, Senior Managers and Managers, and Military Professions, because other aspects of the type of work were considered more important than the similarity criterion, namely policy development and management roles, and military duties respectively. As a result, there are considerable differences in skill levels between employments classified in each of these two groups.

At the higher level of a large group, a distinction is made between professions that are determined essentially by type of activity (as in large group 1 "Farmers and workers in agriculture, fishing and other forest-related activities) and professions that are essentially determined for the use of tools, machinery and by the type of industrial factories (as in major group 7 "Craftsmen and industrial workers") in order to take account of the difference in skills required for professions.

Professions that focus on trades include skilled trades that directly serve the production of goods or services, and whose tasks require an understanding and experience of the natural resources and raw materials used to achieve the desired result. Workers in these employments may also use more advanced technology tools and machinery, provided this does not change the basic skills and understanding required for these employments. Modern machinery and tools can be used to reduce the physical effort and / or time required to perform specific tasks, or to increase product quality.

On the other hand, employment tasks in the professions that focus on the use of tools, machinery and industrial factories essentially require an understanding of machinery: how machinery should be used properly, how to be able to detect a malfunction and what to do then. Required skills focus on the machinery and what it serves rather than on the process itself or on what it results from. Professions whose tasks is to assemble parts of products using strict rules and procedures are considered to belong to the same group as machine-based professions.

Employments that involve a wide range of tasks are classified using priority rules, that is, priority is given to certain tasks in determining the occupational category in which the employment should be classified:

- ✓ in cases where tasks are related to the various stages of the production and distribution process of goods and services, tasks that are related to the stages of production should have priority over related tasks, such as those related to selling and marketing of the same goods, their transportation or management of the production process (unless one of these tasks plays a major role). For example, the worker who bakes his bread and prepares his pastries and then sells them, should be classified as a "baker", not a "seller"; workers who are responsible for operating machines must be classified as machine operators; the driver of a taxi who drives his own car and also keeps accounts must be classified among the drivers of motor vehicle;
- ✓ in cases where the tasks performed usually require skills acquired at different levels of training and experience, employments should be classified depending on the tasks that

require the highest skill level. For example, there are a number of employments whose tasks most of the time require a skill set that can be acquired fairly easily, but workers are also expected to have skills that require more training or experience, so that they are able to cope with unexpected and infrequent situations, for example to avoid accidents or injuries.

C. NOMENCLATURE OF ACTIVITIES AND PRODUCTS

I. Presentation of the nomenclature of activities and products

The nomenclatures of activities (NACAM) and products (NPC) are articulated nomenclatures. The NACAM allows to classify in a coherent and homogeneous way all economic activities by branch. The NPC adopts the same structure as the NACAM (Branches and Classes), reflecting the origin of the products. An additional level of detail (products) breaks down the classes.

The NACAM is based on 6 numeric positions including 3 digits for branches and 3 digits for classes. It is accompanied by a nomenclature of NPC products which indicates for each class of activities the list of products.

The notion of activity characterizes **what an enterprise or a production unit does**. It is distinct from the notion of employment, which characterizes what the individual does: his trade, his duty, his role, etc. For example: an individual who drives a truck of Les Brasseries du Cameroon to deliver beer crates has for profession driver; **code 6605** of the nomenclature of jobs. The activity of the enterprise in which he works is "Manufacture of beer and malt"; **code 013001** of the nomenclature of activities.

For ECAM 5, the NACAM is used to provide information on:

- ✓ SECTION 04 "Employment and income of household members", question Q (4.30) and Q (4.52).
- ✓ SECTION 10: "NON-AGRICULTURAL ENTERPRISES", question Q (10.17).

The products are coded in 9 positions including 3 digits for the branches, 3 digits for the classes and 3 digits for the products.

For ECAM 5, the NPC is used to provide information on:

- ✓ SECTION 10: "NON-AGRICULTURAL ENTERPRISES", question Q (10.16).

II. Activities-products match

The NPC that is attached to NACAM and more generally, to a branch of NACAM, corresponds in products to a heading or group of the NPC. The NPC has a higher level of detail on the products which in some cases still has no match in activities. The activities-products match in the same framework makes it possible to describe and classify at the same time the production units according to their activity (main) and products - goods or services - which result from it.

However, the logic of articulation of activities and corresponding products has some exceptions for certain branches of activity (016, 017, 023, 024, 025 and 026). In fact, to each of these branches of activity, sub-contracted operations involved in the manufacture of the products of the branch are related. These products are however not homogeneous enough to be related to the same class of activities. This is why they are isolated from the classes of activities that make up the branch. In addition, these products, although the result of the activities of independent enterprises, are valued in the final product of the ordering enterprise, since they are not visible,

can not be sold on the market or dissociated from it. In this context, these products take the code XXX000000, where XXX represents the code of the branch.

III. Activity classification criteria

An activity should be understood as a process, i.e. a combination of resources (equipment, workforce, manufacturing technique or products) that results in specific goods or services. By convention, a single activity is defined as a process resulting in a homogeneous series of products.

Each enterprise should have a specific activity. When in the same enterprise, all or part of the resources are used for the manufacture of two different products, one of the processes should be considered as a secondary activity. The distinction is made on the basis of value added and the least contributive process is considered a secondary activity.

The main criteria used to define the branches and classes (or sub-branches) of NACAM concern the characteristics of the activities carried out by the production units. These characteristics are very important in determining the degree of analogy of the unit structure and correlations that exist in the economy. Thus, the main characteristics used are:

1. the nature or character of the good produced or service provided;
2. the use made of that good or service;
3. the nature of raw materials and production processes and techniques.

To this can be added secondary criteria which are dependent on the specific economic organization of the country.

IV. Codification of activities and products

To properly codify the activity, you must describe exactly what the production unit does and the main products and/or services that result from its activity.

The nomenclature does not list all the products that may be found in enterprises or production unit. This would be impossible. When the interviewer is confronted with the codification of a product that is not mentioned in the nomenclature, two cases may arise:

- a) there is a product that is very close (similar) to the one observed. It will then be codified in the same way. Thus, the item "Cow meat" has not been provided, but it is clear that cow meat must be codified in the same way as beef or veal of the item produced "meat from cattle".
- b) there are no products close enough, the product will be coded as "Other xxxx n.e.c." in the same sub-group. As a general rule, headings (or groupings of headings) end with lines with the terms Other xxxx n.e.c.

Please note: For some headings, you will find no line with "Other ... n.e.c.".

To avoid any risk of omission, the interviewer must codify the products in the evening or at the latest, the day after the interview, outside the respondents' residence, so as not to overuse their time unnecessarily.

These nomenclatures are divided into 4 major items: primary sector activities, industry activities, trade activities and service activities.

1. Primary sector activities

This group includes activities that consist in the exploitation of natural, plant or animal resources. These are agriculture, livestock and hunting, forestry and logging, and fishing. This group corresponds to **codes 001001 to 004003**.

Particular case: The picking of palm wine is considered a processing activity; it is coded as "Manufacture of other alcoholic beverages" (**code 013002**).

2. Industry activities

This is the extraction, processing of raw materials into finished products, production and distribution of electricity, gas and water, and construction. This group corresponds to **codes 005001 to 031003**.

3. Trade

This group corresponds to the purchase-resale in the state, i.e. without processing, of goods and repairs of vehicles and motorcycles. It includes the repair of vehicles and motorcycles, trade of vehicles and motorcycles, accessories and fuels trade, wholesale trade, retail trade and activities of intermediaries in commerce. It corresponds to **codes 032001 to 032014**.

The item "Other wholesalers" (**code 032007**) also includes wholesale intermediaries. The same applies to the item "Retail trade..." (**codes 032008 to 032014**), which includes retail intermediaries.

Particular case: Retail sale of meat, without processing, is a retail business (**codes 032008 to 032014**). If, on the other hand, the individual is a butcher who buys live animals, slaughters and cuts them to sell the meat at retail or wholesale, the activity of the production unit is industrial: "Production, processing and preservation of meat and meat products" (**code 007001**).

4. Service activities

These activities include catering, transport, telecommunication, financial intermediation, insurance, business services, public administration, education, health, associations, services to people, etc. This item corresponds to **codes 033001 to 043000**.

V. Notes on the use of the nomenclature

The risks of confusion between business sectors are significant, as the examples below show.

1. *Distinction between primary sector or industry and trade*

Primary sector or industrial activities should not be confused with trade when the products are sold by the producer himself.

A breeder who sells his cattle at the market does not trade; the activity of his production unit is of primary type: "Cattle breeding" (**code 002001**). The same applies to the farmer who sells plantain that she produces; the activity is "Banana growing" (**code 001003**).

The doughnut maker who sells her doughnuts herself, works in a production company "Bread, biscuit and pastry making" (**code 011001**) and not in a trading company.

The lady who sells *cassava stick*, is in a business unit, if she buys bagged *cassava stick* to sell at retail at the market (**code 032013**). If she buys cassava or grows it, makes *cassava stick* and sells them at retail at the market, therefore, she works in an industrial production unit: "Manufacture of cassava-based products" (**code 008003**).

2. *Distinction between services and trade*

The production unit of the roast fish vendor or seller of doughnuts with beans and pap has an activity of "Catering and off-licences" (**code 033002**) and not a business activity. Similarly, an off-license owner who has a few seats where customers often sit for drinks has a "Catering and off-licenses" activity (**code 033002**) and not in the trade.

3. *Distinction between services and industry*

A self-employed seamstress works in an industrial production unit, if she mainly makes her turnover in the manufacture of garments: "Manufacture of clothing items (excluding footwear)" (**code 015004**). If, on the other hand, she works mainly to repair clothes for one or more thrift stores, therefore, this is a service activity: "Repairs of personal and household property" (**code 042006**).

The shoemaker works in an industrial production unit, if the main activity consists in the manufacture of footwear "Manufacture of footwear, including rubber and plastic footwear" (**code 016002**). If, on the other hand, she works mainly to repair footwear, therefore, this is a service activity: "Repairs of personal and household property" (**code 042006**).

4. *Other remarks*

- Plumbing repair work is classified under "Installation work" (**code 031002**).

- Ministries, delegations and local bodies are classified under "General public administration activities and services provided to the entire community" (**code 039001**). The Hydrocarbons Prices Stabilization Fund (HPSF) and Shrinking Fund of Cameroon (CAA) are classified under this group; as well as Central Bureau of the Census and Population Studies (BUCREP) and the National Institute of Statistics (NIS).

- Establishments providing education services (schools, secondary schools, high schools, etc.), whether public or private, are classified under the item "Education" (**code 040000**). But the supervising Ministry, for example the Ministry of Basic Education or the Ministry of Secondary Education, is coded as **039001**.

- The same applies to health services (health centre, dispensary, medical office, analysis laboratory, etc.) coded under the item "Activities for human health" (**code 041001**), while the Ministry of Public Health is classified under **039001**.

- Public enterprises are classified according to their main activity. Thus:

- CRTV (Cameroon Radio Television)= "Television programming; broadcasting" (**code 035003**).
- SCDP (Cameroon Petroleum Depots Company) = "Warehousing, auxiliary transport activities" (**code 034006**).
- NSIF (National Social Insurance Fund)= "Compulsory social security" (**code 039002**).

- For people working for a household, as domestic workers (driver, cook, security guard, etc.), the activity of the enterprise is "Domestic services" (**code 042004**).

- There is a blurred boundary between what may be described as processing or not. In these cases, please refer to your supervisor if in doubt.

The interviewer should be careful to avoid confusion when coding products. For example,

Fabric and loincloth

Unprocessed loincloth is **coded 015002001** "Cotton fabrics" or **015002002** "Other textile fabrics"; while the fabric processed into garment is coded **015004001** "Textile garments".

Please note: The call box service (calls, credit transfers, **prepaid card sales**, etc.) is coded **035004000** "telecommunications service (including call box)".

D. NOMENCLATURE OF TIME USE

This nomenclature concerns SECTION 21 “Time use” and the coding of questions Q103 and Q110.

The survey method adopted is therefore the 24-hour reminder interview of what the person did the previous day with the recording of activities in hourly increments.

At the end of the interview, it should be possible to retrace the course of the day preceding the interview with the interviewee, in hourly time slots. This agenda should be viewed as the product of the end of the interview.

During the interview, we must try to get the person to remember what they were doing in each time slot, write down as precisely as possible what they are saying (example: looking for firewood, travel time to a site etc.).

For example, if the person talks about field work immediately after breakfast, it is advisable to look at the time used for the trip.

The activities could possibly be related to the specific context. For example breeding environment, picking period, and for categories of people, according to sex, age, educational and professional status, etc.

The survey produces statistical data on all the activities carried out by the population in the course of a day. The ICATUS nomenclature (International Classification of Activities for Time Use Statistics) which makes it possible to distinguish the activities defined as being in the productive field or the non-productive field. The productive field is split into two so-called economic and non-economic groups (unpaid services for the benefit of one's own household, other households or the community as a whole). This nomenclature includes nine (09) major divisions, sub divisions and groups. The main divisions are:

ICATUS is intended to serve as a standard classification of the activities that a person can undertake during the 24 hours of a day. Activities are defined as tasks undertaken by people. Time units are used to produce statistics on the time spent on certain activities.

The main classification criterion that was used in the construction of ICATUS is the “productive” character of an activity. Daily activities can be categorized into those that are considered productive and those that are “unproductive” (personal activities) from an economic / SNA perspective. An activity is said to be productive or falls under the "general production limit" if it meets the third person criterion (the activity can be delegated to another person and give the same desired results)
